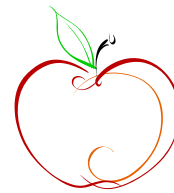


Countryside Montessori School

Happy November! We have definitely entered into the Fall season! The leaves are changing color and falling to the ground. The children are enjoying running through the leaves and listening to the crunching sounds they make. Please remember to dress your child appropriately each day. Also, please make sure your child has an appropriate extra set of clothes here at Countryside.

October was fire prevention month and at Countryside, November is Pest Control Reminder month. As you are aware, the weather is getting colder which means our six and eight legged friends will be heading indoors. So, please take time to exterminate your house. Over the last year, there has been an increase in brown recluse spiders in our area. We have also had a couple families who have had children bitten by spiders at home during the late summer months. In one case, the spider was found under the sheet in the child's bed. Another family found the spider in a toy box. So, please don't forget to spray inside and outside of your house or call the exterminator.

With the weather getting colder, I would like to take this time to remind our parents and caregivers about our Car Safety Policy...There will be absolutely no toleration for cars left unattended with the engine running or keys left in the ignition. If your car is left unattended with the keys in the ignition, the administrator or any staff member have the right to remove the keys and take them to the office. For the sake of all the children at Countryside please uphold this policy. We understand parents may be in a hurry in the morning; however, it only takes a few seconds to remove your keys from the ignition.

In addition, please DO NOT leave children unattended in your vehicle. If you have an infant and have a child enrolled in either the Toddler or Preschool/Kindergarten program, and would like the staff to meet you at the door please call the classroom when you arrive. A staff member will bring your child to the door so you are in constant sight of your car.

Staff Development and Thanksgiving Break: We will be closed November 26th-28th. The staff will be in workshops and meetings on the 26th and then we will close for Thanksgiving the 27th and 28th. We hope you are able to enjoy time with your family during this break.

Our annual Toy Drive to benefit a local charity will begin next week and will end on Wednesday, December 10th. Please allow your child to pick out a \$5 toy and bring it to Countryside to donate to this wonderful cause. Toys will be delivered to a crisis nursery and given to children whose parents are unable to care for them do to extenuating circumstances. The Preschool children will be asked to talk about their donated toy during circle time.

Anderson is learning to say the color names. Eli enters with a smile and a hug for his teachers and quickly starts his school day routine. Ethan enjoys Montessori time, where he likes the stacking activities. Henry has learned to say all of his teachers' names and he surprised Katie by saying hers for the first time last week. Michael is doing great in MDO. He made the transition to finger food and a sippy cup with ease. Last week, Katie was counting out loud with the children and Molly said "3" before Katie could give the verbal prompt. Navya is adjusting to the classroom routine. Her favorite activity so far, is swinging on the playground. Preston has begun to crawl on all fours and is getting to be pretty fast. He also loves to take steps while holding onto the shelf. Our Toddler classroom continues to be a very active and busy room! A lot of our focus for the last couple weeks has been on helping your child develop consistent work habits as they "choose" work, "use" materials, and then "return" them when they are finished. This requires concentration, a sense of order, and lots and lots of patience.

One of the most important things we can do as teachers to help ensure your child's success is offer a "prepared environment".

Maria Montessori's concept of "prepared environment" is that the environment should be designed to facilitate maximum independent learning and exploration by the child. By having the "prepared environment", your child can work on activities of their own choice and their own pace. By doing so, they experience a blend of freedom and self-discipline and a place designed to meet all of their developmental needs.

Some work that your child will be working on this month will be cutting and tearing paper, water works, sorting, and simple hand transfer works.

Cutting- Your child will be learning how to hold safety scissors and make them open and shut to practice cutting paper. We will also be tearing paper to work their fine motor skills.

Water works- We love to practice pouring! In our wet room, we will be practicing pouring colored water and cleaning it up with sponges. This helps them during family style dining to pour their own milk or water and know when to stop without overflowing.

We will have lots of different art projects for this month, too! We will make turkeys with our hands, paint with corn, create corn out of construction paper and tissue paper, and so much more! Look for special art projects to come home!

As the temperatures start dropping, please make sure that your child has weather appropriate clothes in case an accident happens. Long sleeves, pants and an extra pair of socks for their bin will help us out greatly! We would not want to put them in shorts and a tank if it's freezing outside! :)

If you have any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to ask! We are more than willing to help you in any way you can!!

November has come!! We will be doing a lot of things this month. We will be having a Fall Harvest Feast. This will take place on Tuesday, November 25th. We will hand out more information on this event when it gets closer. This month we will finish up Parent/Teacher conferences. If you did not meet with Ms. Karen regarding your child's assessment last month, the sign-up sheets will be located on the shelf by the shoe bins. Show and Tell will start this month and every child has a special day to bring in an item from their home to share it with their classmates. Parents will be given a reminder card for their date. (Please do not bring in dolls or superheroes, please encourage your child to bring in things that are educational and things that have a purpose). The last thing for the month is our Thanksgiving break. We do NOT have school on November 26, 27 and 28th; school will resume on December 1st.

We will begin our journey around the world! We will start with North America and talk about where it is located on a map and we will discuss the food, the language, and monuments found in North America. The children will get to prick out the continents and glue them on a map and make their own world map! By the end of the year your child should have all the continents glued to their world map. We will also begin talking about islands and gulfs in the geography area this month. In our sensorial area, the children will have an opportunity to work with our smelling bottles and pressure cylinders. The children always enjoy matching the scents and pressure cylinders. The children also continue to master the binomial cube and the red rods.

We have added some new activities to the Practical Life room which include mirror polishing and bubble making. These activities require the child to practice their concentration and their hand eye coordination. The children's skills are improving everyday and we are pleased with their progression. The children will have an opportunity to make pilgrim and Native American hats for our Fall Harvest Feast!

In music, we have introduced instruments to the children and we will be continuing to play them and learn their names and listen to the sound they make for the next few weeks. We put together a marching band last month and played for the toddler classroom and marched around the parking lot out back, the kids loved performing with their instruments.

We look forward to this new month and everything it brings us!
