

# Countryside Montessori School September 2014 Newsletter



As we are now in mid September we are happy to say that most of our children have settled in nicely and are enjoying being at school. We always have a few new children who need a little more time to adjust to the school environment but this is all normal. We have full confidence that October will be an awesome month for everyone! We will have a few children transitioning to new rooms in October but this should be a smooth transition.

We have our first field trip for the new school year coming up this week. We know it is a long drive to Eckert's Farm but this is one field trip that everyone enjoys!! I was very concerned the first time we decided to take the hike to Eckert's but everyone had a great time and the parents were all very happy they attended despite the drive. So, we are hoping for excellent weather and a safe field trip. Remember, when we are on field trips the children are brought by a guardian and in their care throughout the day. Please make sure you are always aware of where your child is at all times; and, that they are following the farm rules. Please remind them not to pick up apples from the ground as they may carry bacteria and are not safe to eat.

We have some big news here at Countryside. Thanks to one of our parents, Dolph and I took a trip out to where the Humane Society keeps their ranch animals, Long Meadow Ranch. We fell in love with a pony named Butterscotch. She is very friendly and was easily led with the lead rope. She has already been ridden by one of the staff at the ranch and the ranch director thinks she will be a good fit for the school. Unfortunately, Khemosabie is around thirty-five years old and is not doing well. The vet was here last week and is running some blood tests to see exactly what may be causing Khemosabie to lose weight. We have increased his feed in hopes that he will put some weight back on. Khemosabie was retired from his pony riding duties last fall and will remain here at Countryside but we will begin training Butterscotch once we have been approved to adopt her from the Humane Society. There seems to be quite a lengthy process when you adopt a farm animal. We have to submit photos and referrals from the vet and ferrier. We believe all will be approved and we will bring Butterscotch to Countryside in about two weeks.

Reminders: Please do not leave your car running when you bring your child into the classroom. This is a policy here at Countryside. If a staff member sees your car running they will remove your keys and bring them to the office. Thank you for helping us keep Countryside safe.

As many parents have heard there is a new respiratory virus in the Midwest. Please help us keep the children safe here at Countryside and keep your child home if they develop any new flu like symptoms. Please remember our sick policy: children must be symptom free, without the aid of medication, for 24 hours before returning to school. In addition, with the new virus in our area we have sent children home who appear to be sick but do not have a fever. If your child does not appear to feel well please keep them home. We understand that parents can only miss so much work but if your child cannot fully participate in all activities of the classroom then they should not be at school. Thank you for your help and understanding.

Some things you will notice in our classroom this year will be our Kindness chain. This is when a teacher witnesses a student doing something nice for another student or for their environment we will put a link on our chain for their good deed. The goal of this activity is to promote kindness and peace throughout the classroom. At the end of the year the students get to take the chain outside and see how long it has become, and they get to see how many kind acts they have done throughout the year. Children also have an opportunity to receive "helping hand stickers" everyday as well. This also encourages the children to help one another and their surroundings which is instant positive feedback. Every year we have a family tree/wall, which displays all the student's family photos. In order for our tree to be complete we ask the parents to send in a photo of your family, so we can hang it up on our wall for the year. We are also continuing the "All About Me" book. Attached to this newsletter is a form for you and your child to fill out and bring back to school by September 20<sup>th</sup>. We will bind all the forms together, to make a book. This book will be out all year round for the students to look through. We hope this book will help our students get to know each other a little better. We have many opportunities for parents to help out in the classroom such as making play dough, bringing in fresh flowers, guest reader and culture lessons. Sign-up sheets will be in the classroom all year round.

This month we will be teaching the students the ground rules of our preschool classroom and getting them use to the routine. We will also be giving lessons on how to use the material that surrounds their classroom environment. We will learn about our Solar System, and we will be looking at the stars and planets every week and talking about things we might see on the different planets. The students will also be learning about birds and the parts of a bird and we they live. Throughout the year the students will work with living and nonliving activities, plant and animal activities and much more. The students will practice their fine motor skills in the Practical Life area and learn about their senses in our Sensorial area as well. We have many activities to help your child learn numbers and practice their math skills. We will have parent/teacher conferences twice a year. Once in the fall and once in the spring, so parents will always know how their child developing in our classroom.

We have a student volunteer from Westminster this Fall. His name is Mr. Caleb and he helps us with some behind the scenes work as well as reading to the children. Our volunteers are never left alone with a child and are not allowed to help them in the bathroom. They are only there to assist where needed. Mr. Caleb is with us for two hours on Thursday mornings.

We are very excited about this upcoming year, and I am looking forward to meeting everyone!
